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



Our teachers dedicate their lives to helping us. They love to educate their students selflessly.


They help us to succeed and do great things in life without expecting anything in return.

Gerunds

A gerund is a verb that ends in *-ing*. It is also a word that functions as a noun and expresses an action or a state of being. For example:


- *Learning* from our teachers is so much fun!

Often gerunds are the objects of a preposition since they act and function like nouns. For example:

- We talked about *organizing* the meeting on Tuesday.

In a negative sentence, 'not' goes before the gerund. For example:

- When *not attending* school, you should always call in advance to get your homework.
